50% of children who live less than 5 km from their school are driven by their parents instead of being allowed to walk due to safety concerns?

The reduction in active travel among students has repercussions on schoolchildren and the environment:

- decreased physical activity of students
- impacts on their health and their concentration in class
- increases car traffic, decreased safety around schools, air pollution, etc.

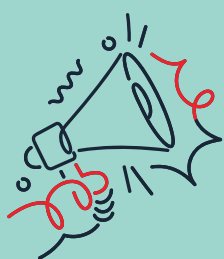
Educational approach

The activity

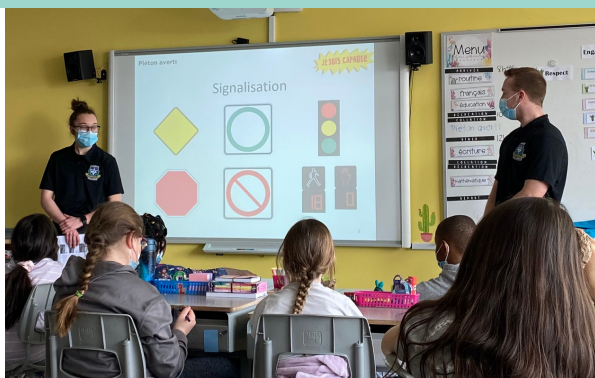
This training aims to teach 3rd and 4th year students the habits and behaviors that will help ensure their safety and independence when walking
